PRODUCT DESCRIPTION: As is traditional with porcelain tiles, Florim USA porcelain tile products are manufactured in a high temperature kiln process. The temperatures attained there initiate physical and chemical transformations and reactions resulting in the formation of a hard, dense structure characterized by low porosity that is chemically inert. Florim USA porcelain tiles contain no VOCs, are nonflammable, and do not produce smoke or release toxic gases when exposed to elevated temperature. Their low porosity prevents the absorption of liquids, vapor, toxic substances or micro-organisms thereby preventing the generation of reactions, putrefaction, or microbial growth.
